

Construction of 24-inch and 16-inch diameter water lines along 10<sup>th</sup> Street is complete. All pipeline is now installed and street restoration is underway. Patching of 10<sup>th</sup> Street from Covington Avenue to Cherry Street should be completed by Atmos Energy by December 18, 2009. This patch will be a temporary surface to provide a smoother driving surface until a permanent curb to curb overlay can be installed in the spring of 2010. It became necessary for BGMU to defer the permanent asphalt overlay when Atmos required replacement of their lines along 10<sup>th</sup> Street, and inclement weather resulted in early shut down of asphalt batch plants for the winter.

The water line being replaced along 10<sup>th</sup> street is an old 20-inch cast iron line that can no longer provide all the capacity required to meet the growing water demands for the area. The new line consists of a 24-inch diameter ductile iron water line from Reservoir Hill to 31-W Bypass, and a 16-inch diameter ductile iron line to supplement the existing 16-inch line from 31-W Bypass to South Park Drive.
