Twyman Awarded TVA Power Play Scholarship

(Bowling Green, Ky.) -- Makenna Twyman, daughter of Christy and Kory Twyman, Bowling Green, is the recipient of a \$4,000 college scholarship awarded by the Tennessee Valley Authority Power Play Scholarship Association. She is one of 35 scholarship winners selected for this distinguished honor.

Twyman was also selected as the 2021 recipient of the Johnny Hayes Memorial Scholarship. This special award recognizes the student who demonstrated the most commitment to excellence in academics, leadership and community service.

Twyman has been part of many student and community organizations throughout her high school career, all while maintaining a 4.0 GPA. She will graduate from Bowling Green High School in May and plans to attend Western Kentucky University to study nursing.

Scholarship recipients are chosen by an eight-member selection team of educators from colleges and universities in the seven states of the Tennessee Valley and are selected based on academic achievement, standardized test scores, leadership qualities, letters of recommendation and written essays.

Made up of 16 local power company managers representing the Valley region's 154 LPCs and TVA representatives, the Power Play Scholarship Association has awarded 673 scholarships totaling more than \$2.5 million to children of LPC employees since its inception in 1995. Funds are raised through association membership fees, contributions from TVA and vendors and the annual Power Play Golf Tournament events. The scholarship program encourages students to excel while recognizing the strong partnerships between TVA and distributors of TVA power.
